HCI International 2020 (HCII), jointly with the affiliated Conferences, under the auspices of 21 distinguished international boards of 491 board members from 49 different countries, held under one management and one registration, will take place at AC Bella Sky Hotel and Bella Center, Copenhagen, Denmark.

The conference objective is to provide an international forum for the dissemination and exchange of up-to-date scientific information on theoretical, generic and applied areas of Human-Computer Interaction (HCI). This is accomplished through various modes of communication, such as plenary presentations, parallel sessions, poster sessions, tutorials, exhibitions, Student Design Competition, mentoring sessions, demonstrations, and Late Breaking Work.



The HCII2020 Design Café provides a venue for the discussion and rethinking of important HCI topics of global interest. Inspired by the [World Café method](#), the HCII2020 Design Café aims to provide a small-group forum for productive, critical discussions in a moderated face-to-face group situation and to identify innovative approaches for transferring ideas into practice.

The topics to be discussed are informed by the findings of the article "[Seven HCI Grand Challenges](#)", which arise in the current and emerging landscape of rapid technological evolution towards more intelligent interactive technologies, coupled with increased and widened societal needs, as well as individual and collective expectations that HCI, as a discipline, is called upon to address. The article presents the results of the collective effort of a group of 32 experts involved in the community of the Human Computer Interaction International (HCII) Conference series. In particular, the HCII2020 Design Café will specifically address the Grand Challenge of **Human-Environment Interactions**.



The findings and results of the HCII2020 Design Café will be published.

Participation in the HCII2020 Design Café is open to registered Conference participants as well as to interested non-registered individuals (i.e. no need to register for the HCII2020 conference). The event will be of interest to professionals, academic / research staff, students from universities and design schools, individuals working in design or R&D departments in industry, government institutions, service providers, etc. Registration is required for all participants. As the number of places is limited, applications will be treated on a first-come, first-served basis.
